

From the Rector's Desk

Our Covenant has been nominated by the Diocese to apply for a new Lily Grantfunded project at Iona called "Thriving Bi-Vocational Congregations." This program has been developed in order to support and empower bi-vocational congregations to embrace their unique call and to thrive in it. Bi-vocational congregations are diverse. They can be led by laity, non-stipendiary clergy, or clergy serving multiple calls. That last one is us!

As I said in my Rector's Annual Report, our model of church as a Covenant between multiple parishes is an exciting re-imagining of what a church can be. Bivocational congregations are one of the fastest growing segments of the church right now.

This program includes workshops and conversation over Zoom, one-on-one mentoring, and work on some projects within the congregation to implement what we are learning in the program. The three prongs of learning are spiritual formation, vocational discernment as a congregation, and asset-based community development to deepen our relationships with our local contexts.

The program is a three-year commitment. They ask that the entire congregation commits to this work together. The meetings are attended by a team of three people from the congregation, including me as the rector. That team can be made up of a bench of volunteers who rotate attending the meetings. That team of volunteers would share our learnings with the Covenant and work with both churches to develop any projects we do.

Right now we are in the phase of discerning whether we do feel called to apply for this program. The application is due April 16. I believe that this is an exciting possibility for our covenant. The program goals are precisely the questions that your Leadership Council has been beginning to explore. I believe that having partners on that exploration and gifted leaders helping us to discern how we thrive as who we are as a Covenant would be a gift to the council, me, and to both of our churches.

You are invited to a Covenant-wide discussion about this program on Sunday, February 21 at 1:00 pm. The conversation will take place on Zoom, at the same link we use for our services. I hope that you will bring your hopes for our Covenant and your questions about the program. I hope you will join us!

Re-opening Plan Isabel Kempton, Senior Warden

- 1. In-person services at St. Andrew's Church will not be held until clearance is received from the Bishop. Prior to opening, the sanctuary, parish hall and the offices will be cleaned and disinfected by a commercial cleaner.
- 2. The CDC and Diocesan guidelines in regard to social distancing will be followed.
 - a. Masks must be worn and will be provided for those who do not have them.
 - b. There should be no physical contact hugging, kissing, hand-shaking
 - c. Social congregating will be highly discouraged within the building.
 - d. Singing is not permitted but there will be instrumental music.
 - e. Family groups will be seated 6 feet apart in all directions. Approved seats will be indicated.
 - f. Hymnals, prayer books and Bibles will be removed from the pews. The service will be printed in the bulletin as usual including hymns when singing is no longer prohibited.
 - g. The service will be morning prayer.
- 3. Hand sanitizer and masks will be available at the entrances.
- 4. Parish members will enter through the front doors and leave through the courtyard doors. Only those with a physical handicap shall use the door accessible from the ramp.
- 5. The ushers will keep a log of visitors and their contact information.
- 6. Parishioners will pick up the bulletin as they enter. The usher will not hand it to them.
- 7. There will not be a collection during the service. Collection plates will be placed at each door so that we can continue our support of the church.
- 8. Outside groups will not be permitted to use the church until social distancing guidelines have been lifted.
- 9. There will not be a coffee hour following the service.
- 10. Signs about masks and no-contact greetings will be posted. Announcements will remind parishioners not to congregate at the end of the service.
- 11. The ushers will wipe down door handles as part of the closing process.
- 12. The sexton will clean and disinfect the building weekly.
- 13. Children's activity bags and nursery services will not be available.
- 14. Efforts will be made to stream the services to those who cannot attend.

Let no harm come to them. Bless them as they go about their days in this time of pandemic. Amen.


